# E-LEARNING TEAM CONTINUES TO ADVANCE ACADEMIC TECHNOLOGY AT MIDDLESEX COLLEGE

The COVID pandemic underscored the need for a more welcoming and diverse online educational experience for Middlesex College students. The eLearning Department, which started in 2017, works across multiple areas, supporting faculty, students and clubs at Middlesex College through the Canvas online learning platform.

"The Department of eLearning supports faculty in the development, design and deployment of effective online, web-enhanced and hybrid courses," said eLearning Director Michael Sullivan.

"The eLearning Department administers the Learning Management System and manages all facets of distance education development and implementation."

All currently-enrolled spring semester students (7,554) and faculty members (568) are connected through the eLearning Department. That adds up to over 29,000 assignments that go through eLearning Department portals annually.

"COVID put us in the position to provide in-depth support to the whole Middlesex College community through Canvas," said Shannon Osborn-Jones, eLearning Assistant Director. "We had a lot of faculty who already taught online and were using Canvas, but a lot who weren't. The issue is that students coming up from a K-12 background are used to being able to see their grades and assignments online, and by helping faculty master Canvas, we are better able to meet students' needs and expectations, providing them with a more streamlined learning experience."

The department has undertaken a pair of new initiatives through the English Department. The first is the creation of a software model that helps students understand the concept of plagiarism and methods to avoid it. The second is the formation of a critical thinking advocacy program that helps students from reciting fallacies or parroting incorrect facts.

The eLearning Department also provides helpdesk support for faculty and students for Canvas and has the job of making sure that the information supplied by faculty on Canvas meets all Americans with Disabilities Act standards to maintain accessibility.
