ALUMNA EXCELS AT RIDER UNIVERSITY AND IS HEADED FOR MEDICAL SCHOOL

Adversity hit Sanjana Butala at the wrong time. She used Middlesex College to make things right.

"Middlesex College built a lot of confidence in me, not only in terms of learning leadership skills, but it acted as the launchpad for my career," Butala said. "The greatest thing was how welcoming the faculty were. I am still connected to so many of them. The connections I was able to build at Middlesex helped me create a second family."

Born in New Brunswick in 2000, Butala moved back to her family's native India after second grade. She had always planned to return to the U.S. to complete her college education, with the help of a relative who had offered to help pay for her schooling. She had always dreamed of being a doctor.

But then everything went awry. Butala's relative wasn't able to help at the last minute. Butala arrived back in New Jersey in August of 2019 needing money for school and a place to start her college education.

Enter Middlesex College.

"A friend suggested coming to Middlesex and my mom had studied for a year there and said it would be a good place to start," Butala said. "I tell people I found Middlesex in a strange way, but it set up my education for my life."

Butala applied for financial aid and found a job at the Middlesex College New Brunswick Center in the fall of 2019. Within a month, she had risen to a leadership position, and was studying biology.

During her time on campus, she served as president of the Indian Student Association and the New Brunswick Center Student Club, and President of Service for Phi Theta Kappa.

After graduating from Middlesex College in May 2021 with an Associate degree in Biology Pre-Professional Science Transfer, Butala transferred with a full scholarship to Rider University. Butala will graduate from Rider this May and has been selected as the Class Valedictorian. Butala has been accepted to three different medical schools and is contemplating which one to attend. She would like to work in underdeveloped countries as a reconstructive surgeon helping burn victims and children with facial deformities, perhaps through a charitable organization.

"Whatever I have got, it's just unbelievable," Butala said. "It's almost impossible to have dreamed that I have come this far and I thank Middlesex College for that."

MEN'S VOLLEYBALL'S DEBUT SEASON ENDS WITH A FLOURISH

The Spring 2023 semester marked the inaugural season of NJCAA Men's Intercollegiate Volleyball on the national level, and Middlesex College was one of four two-year schools in New Jersey that competed. Among those schools, the College placed second in the regular season with a 9-9 record. Head Coach Myia Williams led the Colts to the playoffs, where they won their first-round game against Union College before falling in the championship to Ocean County College. Michael Nycz was named the Garden State Athletic Conference and Region XIX Player of the Year and Tyler Ryan received First Team Garden State Athletic Conference and First Team Region XIX honors for their outstanding play. The other two-year colleges in New Jersey who competed this season were Ocean County College, Passaic County College and Union College.
