# THE ART OF THE GRANT

Grants afford Middlesex College an array of benefits, enhancing the College's ability to fulfill our mission and better serve our students and community. They also help bring the innovative ideas of our faculty and staff to fruition.

That new state-of-the-art equipment in the Dental Hygiene Clinic? A grant helped with that.

A state-of-the-art simulation suite for the Nursing Program? A grant helped underwrite the costs.

More than 10,000 students attending college in New Jersey collectively saved over \$1.5 million in textbook costs last year, all made possible by a grant.

Yamillet Febo-Gomez has served as the Director of Grants at Middlesex College for the past five years. In addition to providing leadership in applying for and securing grants, she also plays a crucial role in the administration and utilization of grant funds at the College. The College currently has over 90 active grants totaling more than \$9 million.

"One thing I love about this grants organizational model is it improves our ability to craft more effective proposals by allowing us to articulate specific details about how the funds will be utilized," Febo-Gomez explains. "You have to understand the financial dynamics of a college like ours. We operate under stringent regulations surpassing the regulatory framework of many other types of institutions and organizations."

Writing a grant proposal is an inexact science, but the team at Middlesex College bats nearly 1000 when they apply. The key is comprehending the goals of the grantproviding organization and what it is looking to achieve with funding a proposed project. The Grants Office collaborates with faculty and staff to align their ideas with the grant funder's vision and Middlesex College's goals in order to secure funding.

"A lot of times people say grant writing is just strictly adhering to application guidelines," Febo-Gomez said.

"However, we take a different approach. We delve deeper to discern the trends and grasp the funders' unspoken priorities. It's essential to communicate in their language to capture those nuances."

Opportunities continue to unfold. Febo-Gomez is enthusiastic about the recently-secured Title V grant from the U.S. Department of Education, which aims to strengthen the connection between students and the College's resources. Additionally, a recent grant designated to better support adult learners and justiceimpacted students has propelled the total grants acquired during her tenure at the College to over \$20 million.

"It might not seem significant," Febo-Gomez laughed, "but it's quite substantial. When I assumed the role, we were only securing \$2.8 million."

Middlesex College's appeal to philanthropic organizations lies not only in its diverse student population but also in the remarkable talent and innovation of its faculty and staff. It is becoming increasingly competitive to secure grants, and our Grants team, led by Yamillet Febo-Gomez, is showing that Middlesex College is up to the challenge.
