# MEETING EMPLOYER NEEDS AND PROVIDING LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES FOR EVERYONE

The Mission of Middlesex College includes a focus on "strengthen[ing] the economic, social, and cultural life of the community."

The staff of the College's Workforce Development and Lifelong Learning (WDLL) Division has cultivated and nurtured partnerships with area employers to identify the employers' needs for training incumbent workers and develop a pipeline of new workers. The WDLL team also reaches out to the community to offer training opportunities, including special populations.

"We reach out to everyone in our community, including individuals in a wide range of circumstances and needs," said Joanie Coffaro, executive director of WDLL. "For example, there is a large population of individuals in Middlesex County for whom English is not their native language. For those English Language Learners, we offer short-term English as a Second Language courses as well as programming to help them prepare to enter the workforce. This summer we will be offering summer camp programs for young people on the autism spectrum."

Coffaro says Middlesex College maintains connections with approximately 70-80 employers to better understand and serve their needs. Coffaro notes that one of the biggest employment sectors in Middlesex County looking for trained workers is healthcare but adds that it can be a challenge to find qualified instructors to train future staff.

"In addition to the employee's work experience and accomplishments, employers are looking for employees with well-developed soft skills as well," said Tracey Montani, director of workforce development. "Employers value effective communication, critical thinking, problem solving, dependability, flexibility, and teamwork."

The division caters to students' needs by understanding where they are now and where they want to go in the future. Some students are on campus solely to get a degree and move on, while others want to combine work and education together, receiving classroom instruction and on-the-job training.

Another goal of the division is to encourage learning at every stage of one's life. For example, early retirees may want to learn a new life skill, foreign language or how to play a musical instrument, and Middlesex College wants to provide that opportunity.

"Lifelong learners are seeking opportunities to enhance their skills, advance in their careers with certificate programs, and/or to have fun doing something new and different, like art, cooking, dance, language," said Natasha James-Waldon, director of lifelong learning. "Our goal is to provide all of the residents in Middlesex County with the opportunity to explore the lifelong learner that resides within them."

"Through strategic relationships with employers, we connect employers looking for employees with individuals of all abilities who are looking for employment," said Coffaro. "We work with individuals who may be interested in developing skills in a short amount of time that will position them for a betterpaying job or a new career. That can be different from those who just want to come here and get an associate degree and move on. We provide different opportunities for people to explore, thrive and grow."
