ATHLETICS DEVELOPING LEADERS ON AND OFF THE FIELD

Interest in and enthusiasm for Middlesex College Athletics is at an all-time high, and the Colts continue to be winners on the field and in the classroom.

Middlesex College Athletic Director Rocco Constantino notes there were 191 student-athletes competing for the Colts this school year, the highest number in nine years.

"It's directly related to the hard work of our coaches," Constantino said. "They've put in a ton of time recruiting and make it a point of emphasis to get out to high school games and travel games. They recognize that building up our rosters creates benefits all across the school community."

Middlesex College's women's and men's basketball teams made the leap this year to Division II in the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) and met the challenge of a higher level of competition. The men won the NJCAA Garden State Athletic Conference championship, while the women made it to the first round of the NJCAA Region XIX playoffs.

Men's basketball coach Winston Smith was named the New Jersey Division II Coach of the Year.

"It's always nice to be recognized, but I tip my hat to the players and the administration at Middlesex College for putting me in a great place to succeed," said Smith. "I can't wait to get back to work with the great student-athletes that we have."

Seven of the nine athletic programs at Middlesex College made it to the post-season this academic year.

Colt student-athletes have also contributed time in service projects around campus and Middlesex

County, volunteering for Read Across America, working with the Food Pantry on campus, and helping out at youth clinics.

"Again, that's a message that comes from our coaches that as athletes you have a heightened spotlight on you and you should contribute to your community," said Constantino. "I'm proud that our coaches and players are involved in community work."

While every school wants a successful sports team, or two, or three, Constantino also understands the main goal is to produce winning students.

"We stress that a lot in our meetings with coaching staff," said Constantino. "We always monitor our athletes' academic performance and try to give them what they need. If they need an extra day off from practice to attend a study hall or do extra work, we understand the big picture. We want to win championships, but we're here to support our student-athletes as student-scholars as well."
