# PROMOTING A CULTURE OF THE ARTS AT MIDDLESEX COLLEGE



Middlesex College's Department of Visual, Performing, and Media Arts (VPMA) engages a diverse population on campus and provides students with the opportunity to explore their talents in acting, dance, or mastering the latest computer animation technology.

"There are different experiences that we can expose them to," said Annie Hogan, VPMA department chair. "We're an open institution, you don't need to audition to be here, and we have people who come here with zero experience, but they love it and have a passion for it. We try to tap into that passion, because if you have a passion for something and you're committed, you're going to make it."

Middlesex College offers 11 different academic programs in eight disciplines and Hogan oversees multiple facilities on campus where shows are performed.

These type of events – an art show, a dance revue, a concert – are all important to Hogan's goal of using the arts to further community outreach.

"We always have a lot going on, and if there isn't more, I will make more," Hogan laughed.

Among the community events Middlesex College students participate in include an exhibition of work



by fine arts students at the Mexican Consulate in New Brunswick, the PACE Mural Robert Wood Johnson project collaborating on artwork displayed in a hospital setting, and the Teen Arts Festival for Middlesex County residents aged 13-19 years old.

Throw in the various theatre productions like the fall presentation of *Dracula* and last spring's performances of *Footloose*, and there's always something on the marquee.

"Our students rock my world," said Hogan proudly.
"They are really great. The *Dracula* show was one of the best things I have ever seen here."

The VPMA department has become a pipeline for aspiring artists and performers to transfer to Rutgers, New Jersey Institute of Technology, or Fairleigh Dickinson where they can further shine in the bright lights on stage or work as one of the crew members backstage.

"By the time they leave here, our students will know what a good audition looks like," Hogan said. "They will know how to do elevator pitches and meet and greets with talent agents and do all of that. Not only do our students do academics here, but we also try to give them experiences outside the classroom."


#### A SEASON OF GIVING

It's the time of year when we take stock of our blessings – as individuals and as a community – and provide a helping hand to those in need.


