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# EMPOWERING DATA-INFORMED DECISION MAKING AT MIDDLESEX COLLEGE

The Office of Institutional Research and Assessment at Middlesex College functions as the school's on-site think tank providing stakeholders timely, precise data to help make informed decisions to better serve the entire College community.

"We support the decision-making at the College," explains Meghan Alai, Dean of Institutional Research and Assessment. "We provide the data so that our deans and academic department chairs and program

directors have access to information so they can make curriculum decisions."

Institutional Research and Assessment produces both periodic and ad hoc data analyses and reports that can be used by federal, state, and accrediting agencies on a wide variety of topics in addition to enrollment reports and analyses and outcomes studies that support strategic planning and assessment efforts.

The office also maintains an open-door policy at Center 1. If administrators have a question about a population trend or want feedback on an idea for a new program, they can visit any time and ask for the data on hand.

"I work closely with our chairs to get them information," said Alai. "They don't have to be experts on data. They can just sit down and talk about what their needs are and what direction they are heading in. I can tell them what's available or help them come up with a study that gets them what they need."

Institutional Research and Assessment maintains an active intranet database that contains information dashboards where student data can be perused and broken down into various categories. The wide range of stats include, for example, the past five-year headcount and trends by program, gender, and race, and how many students are enrolled in a particular academic program.

This helps Middlesex College develop strategic and

targeted programs and initiatives, like the Some College, No Degree program, which appeals to older college students looking to finish their studies, and provides direction to the College of where to bolster connections to high school communities.

"We are definitely focusing on adult learners in addition to dual enrollment," Alai said. "And building relationships around the whole County. In the world of data and informed decision making, we are here to help you not have to be the expert and get the information you need."

Alai is a Middlesex College alumna who is proud of the contributions made by her department, which includes Rachel Cheng, a research

analyst who compiles studies with various departments around campus, and Shannon Angulo, who helps design surveys and assessments.

"We are a small but mighty team," said Alai. "We are all thrilled to support our students and their goals, because they are the reason that we are here."
