Starting the Semester: As we start the semester, how can we get students to slow down and really think about what we are teaching? What should we spend more time on? What needs less time to learn? In the 2013, but still relevant article, <a href="The Power of Patience">The Power of Patience</a>, <a href="Teaching Students">Teaching Students</a> the Value of Deceleration and Immersive Attention, Jennifer Roberts uses an example from Art History to teach students to go beyond looking, and really see.
