C. 2023 Income Tax Return Filing Status

Important Instructions for Tax Filers (In order to complete verification, you have two options from which to choose to provide tax filing information.)

Option 1: Complete Verification Electronically

As part of federal student aid eligibility, student and parents (as appropriate), will be required to consent and approve sharing and importing income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective. In other words, if the student and parents filed separate 2023 IRS income tax returns, both must provide consent and approval to share and import income and tax information from the IRS. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2023 income information that was transferred into the student's FAFSA using income and tax information directly from the IRS.

Option 2: Complete Verification by Paper

If 2023 income tax return information for the student and parents was not available or could not be used, the student and parents should provide the institution with a 2023 IRS Tax Return Transcript(s) or a signed copy of the 2023 income tax return and applicable schedules.
