The 2021-2022 academic year was a remarkable year for our Middlesex College community.

As we returned to more in-person activities after two challenging years of remote teaching and operations, our communal sense of purpose as a Gateway to a Better Life has never been stronger.

At our 55th Commencement Ceremony in May, we gathered as a community for the first time since 2019 to celebrate the graduation of 1,600 students.

The Class of 2022, some who are highlighted in this Annual Report, is comprised of individuals who have overcome many obstacles in life in order to reach the remarkable achievement of earning a college degree. What their stories reveal is that the College has been a lifeline for our graduates, especially those for whom earning a college degree often seemed out of reach.

The raising of the College flag under its new name in 2020-2021 marked a new era for the College.

In 2021-2022, we continued to take significant steps toward strengthening our identity as Middlesex College. In the digital world we live in, none was more dramatic than the launch of our new website.

The new website, along with its new domain name – middlesexcollege.edu – is designed to be more student-centric and welcoming to prospective students and their families as they navigate their way around higher education; the first time for many.

SECOND CHANCES, PAYING IT FORWARD

KIMBERLY CHRISTINA GARCIA is not one for mincing words. Not when she talks about the mistakes she made in her past. Not when she describes her son Jerimyah as her joy.

And definitely not when it comes to how Middlesex College changed her life.

“It is the foundational place in my life,” said Garcia, who was valedictorian for the Class of 2022.

“Middlesex opened doors for me and allowed me to see that everything that I had been through, all the hurt and anger, I didn’t need to keep it all tucked in. Education is the way out. You can pave your way out of anything with an education.”

Garcia grew up in Union and graduated from Middlesex High School. She went through a rough period in her teenage years. She was incarcerated while in high school and arrested again in 2018.

The birth of Jerimyah opened her eyes to finding a new path.

Middlesex College showed her the way.

“I decided I wanted to give my son a good life, so I enrolled when I was pregnant,” Garcia said. “My first semester was the summer of 2020 and my first full-time schedule was in September. I was working two full-time jobs and a part-time job and, for a while, I didn’t have secure housing for my son, but we made it.”

Originally, Garcia thought she wanted to counsel individuals going through addiction and recovery, but her experience at Middlesex College helped her think bigger. After getting her associate degree in psychology, she enrolled at Rutgers University where she is studying social work and public policy.

Garcia feels that she can use her experience better at a macro-economic level, trying to foster change in policy, like altering expungement laws and creating resources for individuals with a criminal past to move forward in life, providing them with practical skills.

At Middlesex College, Garcia found instructors willing to listen to her, who weren’t worried about her past mistakes, and who were focused on helping her find a path to a brighter future.

In her valedictory speech, Garcia encouraged her fellow graduates to continue to persist in achieving their dreams.

A LIFE-CHANGING MOMENT

T **HOMAS EMENS** was still processing the news that he was awarded the prestigious Jack Kent Cooke scholarship, which provides Emens with up to \$55,000 a year to complete his bachelor's degree, when he was hit with another bit of good fortune – acceptance to Princeton University, his dream school.

"I had worked so hard and so long to get to that day, and to have both dreams come true on the same day, I had to pinch myself to make sure it was true," recalled the political science major. He is continuing his study of politics at Princeton.

That game-changing day meant that:

- 1: Emens would transfer to his dream school to pursue a bachelor's degree, and
- 2: he could achieve his dream without worrying about how to pay for it.

But what made the day even more satisfying for Emens is what it meant for his family and his community.

"I'm a first-generation college student raised by a single mother in a low-income household. So, this opens so many doors for myself, but it also paves the way for other people too."

Emens is used to venturing into uncharted territory. He and his family, including his great grandmother (who turned 98 in July) and nieces and nephews, have been rooted in the Jamesburg community since the 1850s.

Emens serves on several boards in Jamesburg, including the library board.

"I'm the youngest and the first Hispanic and openly gay person to sit on these boards in town. I'm running for town council this year."

Emens' desire to take an active role in the well-being of his community was spurred by his experience at Middlesex College, he says.

"Middlesex College was a guiding light for me during COVID and will always be part of my success story," he says.

"The people there instilled in me not just the skills that I needed to get to this day, but the belief that I could do it, to persevere when things get tough, to believe in how far I could go, and that the world is my oyster."

FINISHING WHAT YOU STARTED

Graduating from Perth Amboy High School in 2004, **JESSICA MEDINA** was interested in continuing her education, but life threw challenges at her. She had a son in 2003, and another in 2006. There were times she lived in a homeless shelter.

Medina found Middlesex College in 2007, and while it was hard to focus with so much happening, she found satisfaction in studying and learning new skills. However, she ran out of time and had to put her education on hold.

Medina started looking at Middlesex College again in the fall of 2021. Much to her delight, she found that her credits from 2007 would apply towards her new degree program. If she really pushed, she would be able to complete her associate's degree in a year.

"My husband always joked, 'You having a degree would be such a dangerous thing.' I always felt too old to go back to school, but, little by little, it started to sink in that maybe I should get my degree."

She enrolled in five classes in the fall semester, three in the winter session, and four more in the spring.

Medina found herself doing things she never expected. She was making all A's, and was named a Jack Kent Cooke scholarship semifinalist. She stepped out of her comfort zone and became president of the Student Law Association.

"In the spring, a lot of my classes were putting us in small groups to work," Medina explained. "I am not usually a people person, but I said, 'I have to figure this out. I can't feel this anxiety for 15 weeks.' So, I put myself out there. That was the best experience the whole spring."

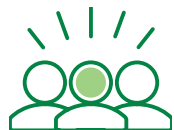
Even though she had one more class to take in the summer, Medina was able to walk at Commencement. After graduation, she enrolled at Rutgers University and is on track to become an accountant.

It took 15 years for Medina to finish what she started, and now she's passing it along.

Her oldest son has registered for classes at Middlesex College – and so has her husband.

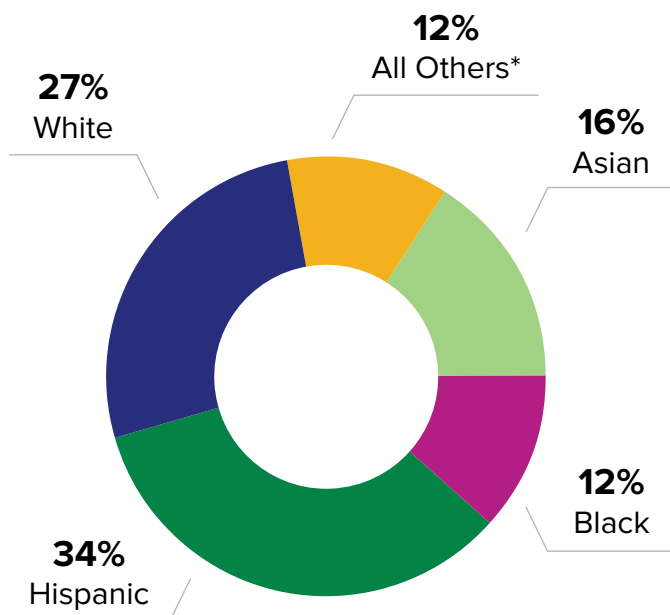

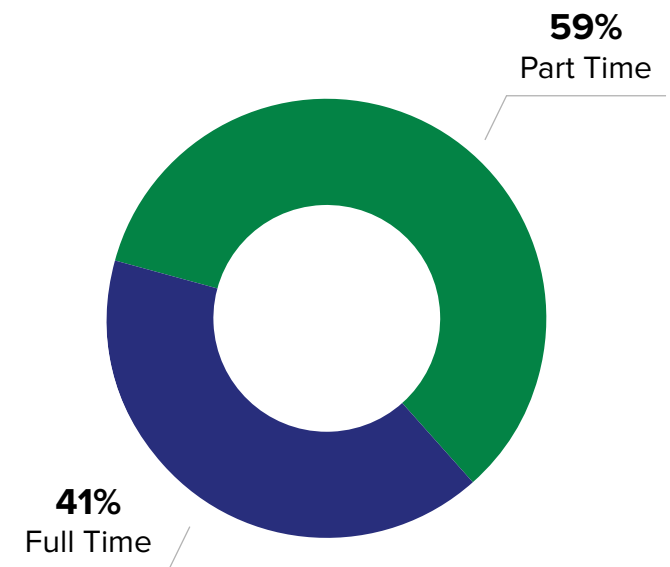

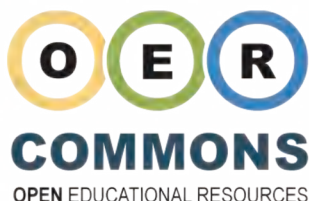
SUCCESS BOUND PROGRAM EXPANDS

Thanks to a multi-year grant from the Rutgers Community Health Foundation, the College implemented four-week healthcare bootcamps to help adult learners in New Brunswick and neighboring towns explore and prepare to enter the healthcare field.



PROVIDING AFFORDABLE TEXTBOOK ALTERNATIVES

The adoption of Open Educational Resources and affordable digital materials through Barnes & Noble's First Day program saved students an estimated \$1 million per year compared to what they would have spent in the past for textbooks.

The College launched a new GED-to-college pathway to encourage high school dropouts and adult learners to reignite their educational ambitions by making the GED-to-college transition seamless and financially rewarding.

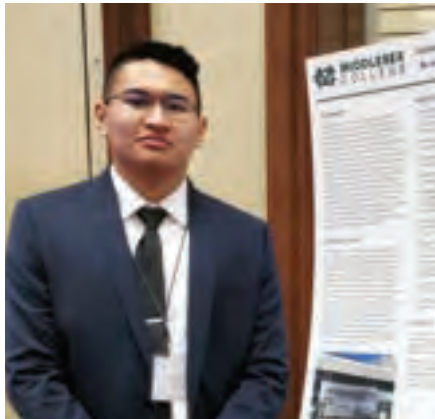


OUTSTANDING STUDENTS

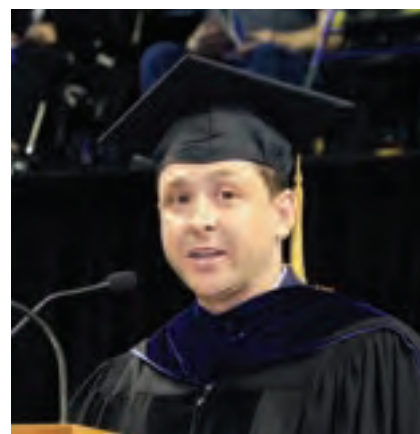

EXPANDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS TO EXPLORE, GROW AND THRIVE



The **Middlesex College Foundation** continues to demonstrate its commitment in providing access to our educational offerings through support of scholarships for tuition and fees for degree-seeking students. But as the past few years have revealed, access alone will not ensure student success. The unprecedented times and the recognition of diverse student needs have led to an intentional redefinition of how the Foundation can support a broad spectrum of student needs with a wide range of resources.

SCHOLARSHIP SUPPORT

While Middlesex College is an open access campus and tuition remains low compared to most other colleges and universities in New Jersey, tuition and fees can still be a barrier for many students. In 2021-2022, more than 326 students were awarded over 606 scholarship awards totaling approximately \$419,425.41. The Foundation was fortunate to receive gifts from donors establishing 11 new scholarships.

PROGRAM AND GRANT SUPPORT

In 2021-2022, program support totaled more than \$678,089.94. Our partners recognize that student dreams are as diverse as their backgrounds, interests, and abilities. One of the more recent and unique gifts was that of the Marisa Tufaro Foundation. This gift recognizes the unique challenges of parenting students, the significant financial burden of childcare costs, and the role high quality care plays in a child's development. The Marisa Tufaro Foundation is a wonderful example of thinking outside the traditional box when providing resources to students.

MEETING THE NEEDS OF THE WHOLE STUDENT

Recognizing that personal financial hardships – including food and housing insecurity, lack of access to reliable transportation, and limited educational resources and technology – can be significant obstacles to completing an education, the Foundation continued to garner support for the services provided through the Middlesex College Resource Hub. Over the last year, 186 donors gave 330 gifts totaling nearly \$45,000 in support of the College's goal to meet basic needs and provide emergency funds. These gifts ranged from \$5 to \$20,000.

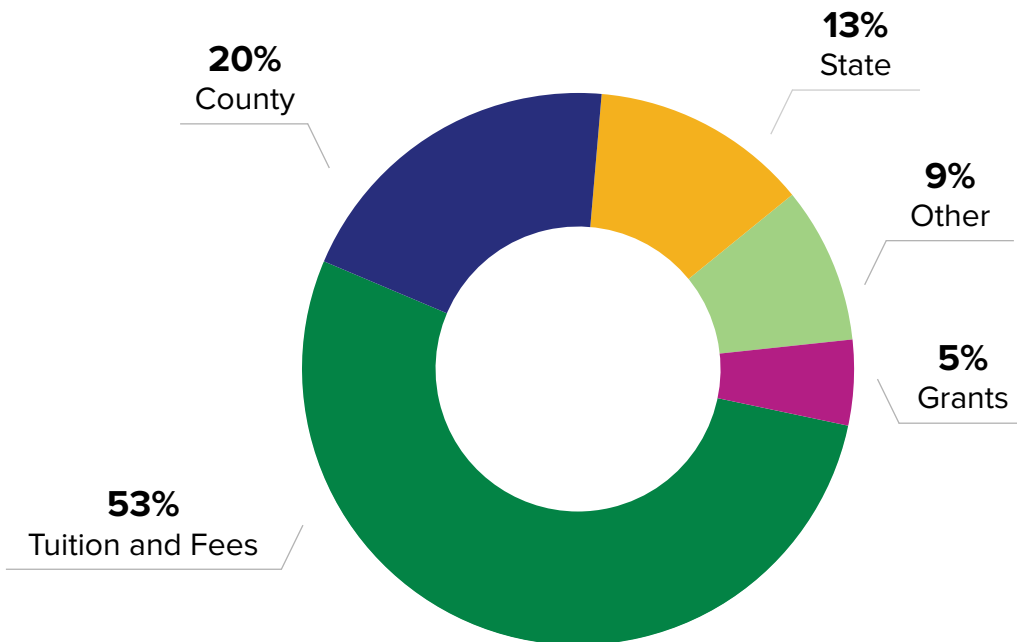

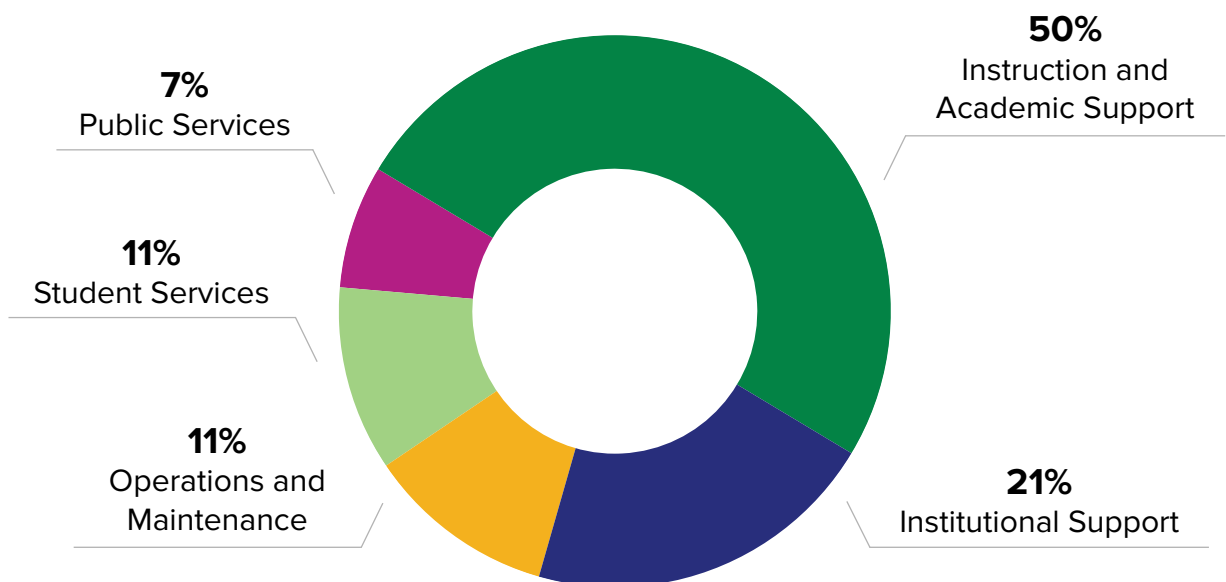

Middlesex College's total operating budget for Fiscal Year 2020-2021 was **\$80,328,341**

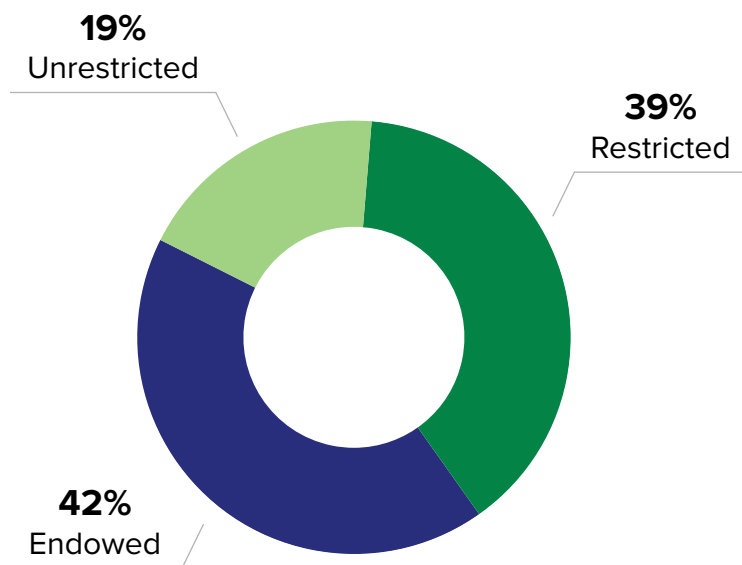


Fiscal Year 2020-2021 College Revenues

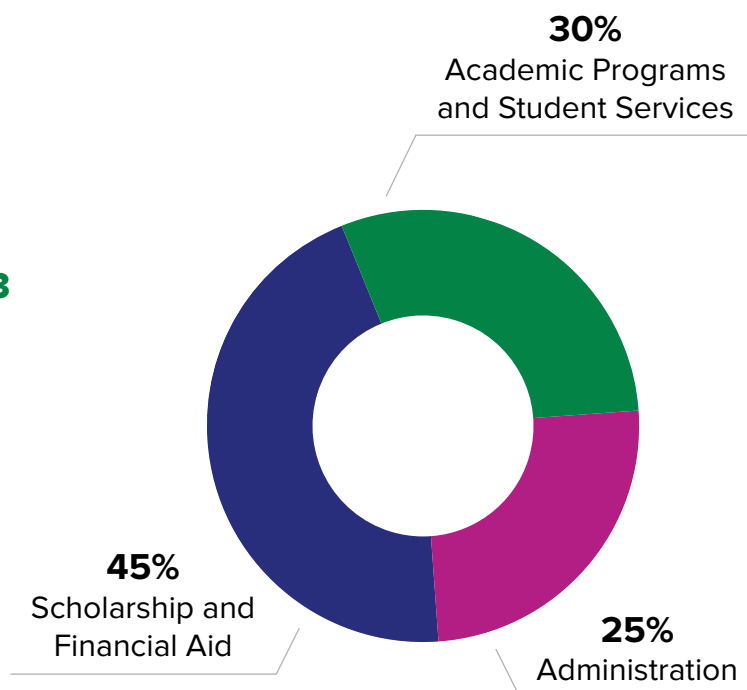


Fiscal Year 2020-2021 College Expenditures

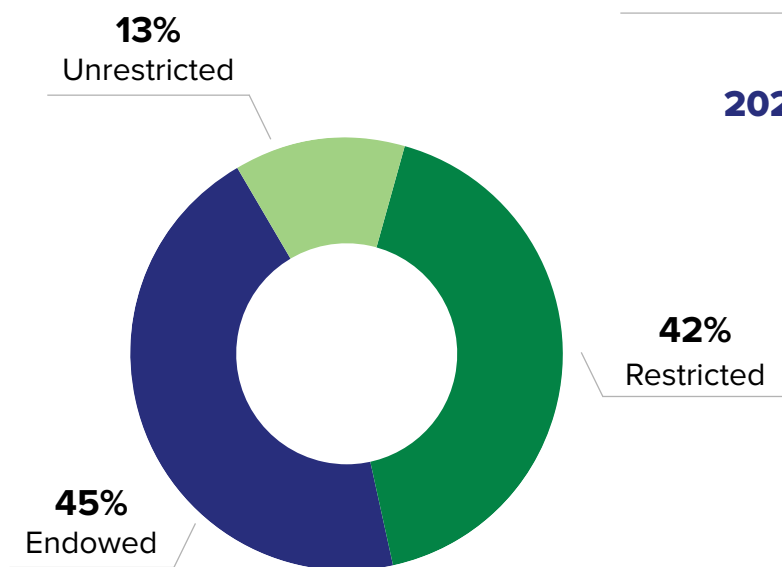
